Known and beloved by movie audiences for their roles in John Ford's *The Quiet Man* - Arthur portraying Reverend Playfair and Barry the quintessential matchmaker and rogue Michealeen Óg, these two stalwarts of the Abbey Theatre Company went on to carve out lives in Hollywood. In a sun-blasted retirement home on the edge of the Mojave Desert, two residents pass their days trading barbs, jokes and grievances as they wait for time to do what it always does. Their brittle comedy masks deeper fears about decline, memory and the approach of death. When a mysterious outsider joins them, the familiar rhythms of their banter begin to fracture, and what starts as a darkly comic portrait of old age shifts into something stranger, more unsettling – and unexpectedly moving.

First presented to great acclaim in 2010, Barry McKinley's *Elysium Nevada* was nominated for the Irish Times Best New Play Award. Scripts is delighted to present this new production.

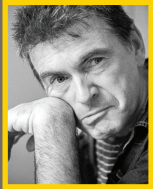




FROM SCRIPT TO ACCESS

A Case Study in Disability-Led Theatre Practice

with Christian O'Reilly & Peter Kearns



How can theatre-makers create disability-themed work that is authentic, collaborative and theatrically compelling? In this case study-based session, playwright Christian O'Reilly and disability activist and facilitator Peter Kearns reflect on the development of *No Magic Pill* and their experience of working within disability-led theatre practice. Together, they will explore the creative and practical considerations involved in bringing disability narratives to the stage, including representation, access, allyship, collaboration and inclusive production processes. Blending discussion and reflection, this session offers an opportunity for playwrights, theatre-makers and artists to engage with the evolving landscape of disability arts practice in Ireland.

Christian O'Reilly is a Galway-based playwright and screenwriter whose work has been produced nationally and internationally by companies including *Druid* and *Rough Magic*. He is the writer of the acclaimed disability rights drama *No Magic Pill*.

Peter Kearns is a disabled activist, facilitator and educator working across disability equality, inclusive arts practice and cultural advocacy. He collaborated on *No Magic Pill* as Disability Equality Dramaturg, actor and outreach producer.

NURTURED NEW WORKS FESTIVAL FINALE

Nurtured New Works is the heart of Scripts – Ireland's Playwriting Festival, where emerging voices are given space to grow, challenge and connect. After a week of mentoring, editing and directing, our selected Scripts Playwrights' plays will be brought from page to stage in a rehearsed reading by some of Ireland's leading actors. The awarded playwright will be chosen by our esteemed judging panel, Selina O'Reilly (The Abbey Theatre) and Mark O'Rowe.

This year, our three selected playwrights, **Liza Costello**, **Elaine Maguire O'Connor** and **Liam McCarthy**, respond to the festival theme, *Desire*, through works that are atmospheric, urgent and deeply human. Across these nurtured plays, desire emerges in many forms: as longing, ambition, grief, hunger for connection, the search for healing, and the need to be seen or understood. Set against worlds shaped by shifting power dynamics, fractured relationships, economic precarity and an undercurrent of unease, the plays move between the intimate and the surreal, the personal and the political. Together, they explore the tensions between what we yearn for and what society, circumstance or fear places out of reach; revealing desire as a force that can unsettle, transform and ultimately reshape how we understand ourselves and each other.

EUGENE O'BRIEN mentors our selected playwrights throughout the festival. Eugene won the Irish Times Theatre Award, the Stewart Parker Award and the Rooney Prize for

Literature for his play *Eden* and his play *Heaven* was awarded an Edinburgh Fringe First and Irish Times Theatre Award in 2023. He also wrote the plays *Savoy* and *Falling to Earth – my summer with Bowie*. Other work includes the TV series *Pure Mule*, winner of five IFTAs and films *The Flag*, *Tarrac* and the screen version of *Eden*. He published his first novel *Going Back* in 2022. A new film *One Sweet Hour*, directed by Declan Recks will be released later this year.

LIZA COSTELLO **IN THE GARDEN**

When Lukas finishes transplanting a laurel tree for one of his wealthy gardening clients, all he wants is to get home in time to take his son to football training. But Marion has questions about the tree – and other reasons for keeping him there. What begins as a minor inconvenience slowly turns into a tense negotiation of class, loneliness and power that asks where 'mere' pushiness might end and violence begin.



ELAINE MAGUIRE O'CONNOR **LAY YOUR HANDS ON ME**

In a dingy bedsit, restless Alannah pushes her broke, aimless boyfriend Bagsy to exploit his alleged healing powers for money. Caught between scepticism and desire – for Alannah, money, and meaning – Bagsy wrestles with a decision that could transform their lives. But when tragedy strikes, they realise something much darker was already in motion.



LIAM MCCARTHY **MAM AND LOVE AND WOO**

Mam is concerned that her son spends too much time at the riverfront of Limerick City. Preoccupied as she is with her love and concern, she hasn't left her house in six weeks. Her quiet life is upended when a well-meaning community volunteer barrels into her world.

DIRECTOR



JIM NOLAN is a playwright and theatre director, a founder member and Artistic Director of Red Kettle Theatre Company, a former Writer in Association at the Abbey Theatre and Theatre Artist-in-Residence at Garter Lane Theatre. His plays have been presented throughout Ireland, in the United Kingdom, the United States and Canada and he has worked as a writer and director with some of Ireland's leading theatre companies. Jim has won several awards for his work, including Sunday Independent Play of the Year for *The Salvage Shop* and Irish Times Theatre Awards Best New Play nominations for *The Salvage Shop* and *Dreamland*. Jim's latest play, *Castel Gandolfo*, opened at Garter Lane Theatre, Waterford, in October, 2024. He is a member of Aosdána and his plays are published by Gallery Press.

JUDGING PANEL



SELINA O'REILLY is a theatre producer and arts administrator currently working as the Literary and New Work Assistant with the Abbey Theatre. Selina has been with the theatre since 2020 and manages all events, workshops and writer development programmes run by the department. Prior to this, Selina worked as a producer namely with Rough Magic Theatre Company, Barabbas... the Company and Calypso Productions and has produced over 25 professional productions. She holds a BA in Theatre and English from St. Mary's University, in Twickenham.



MARK O'ROWE is an Irish writer and director. His plays include *From Both Hips* (Fishamble Theatre Company), *Howie the Rookie* (Bush Theatre), *Made in China* (Peacock Theatre), *Crestfall* (Gate Theatre), *Terminus* (Peacock Theatre), *Our Few and Evil Days* (Abbey Theatre), *The Approach* (Landmark Productions), and *Reunion* (Landmark Productions / Galway Arts Festival). He has also adapted several works, including Ibsen's *Hedda Gabler* (Abbey Theatre), *Druid Shakespeare*, an amalgamation of four of Shakespeare's history plays (Druid Theatre Company), and Ibsen's *Ghosts*, (a Landmark / Abbey Theatre coproduction). Screenplays include *Intermission*, *Boy A*, Perrier's *Bounty*, *Broken* and *The Delinquent Season*, which he also directed. TV includes the series *Temple* and *Normal People*.
