NO ROMANCE: A DESPERATE BUSINESS

"Why all of a sudden does everybody have to know everything about each other? When did we decide that unless we divulge every stupid thought we have, every minute of the day, that we're not living a proper life?"

A funeral home in Dublin. Carmel and Joe have arrived early to Joe's mother's wake. After twenty-four years together, they think they know each other inside out. But while they're here to bury their dead, they begin to uncover secrets, lies and fantasises that they've kept hidden from each other.

Are we entitled to our own private life, secret even from those closest to us? Or in this age of curated online lives and fake news, is honesty all we have?

No Romance by Nancy Harris (*The Dry*) was originally staged as a play in three acts at The Peacock Theatre in 2011. This, the second act, offers an uncanny meditation on how technology, spirituality and the economy was shaping and continues to shape modern love.

Would you kill for a friend? Would you kill your best friend? Do you have what it takes? A tragi-comic dialogue from award-winning playwright, Conor Montague, which interrogates societal attitudes towards care for the terminally ill though the personal trauma of two lifelong friends.

Former All-Star hurler, Martin 'The Butcher' Molloy, is defined by courage, weakened by loss, haunted by failure. The untimely death of his wife forces confrontation with an old friend and inspires a journey through the dark recesses of grief in search of answers, forgiveness and a new beginning.

Counting Swans descends deep into the dark to retrieve slivers of light from within the despair of a broken hero. The nature of love, friendship, illness, courage and assisted suicide are just some of the topics meditated upon over the course of a dialogue that mixes tears with laughter, despondency with hope, and croquet with hurling.

Graduate of the MA in Writing from NUIG and Scripts alumni, Conor Montague is currently working in London where he is co-director of London Writer's Eclective and Resident Playwright at the Irish Cultural Centre, Hammersmith.

She has been nominated for an IMRO award for Best Radio Drama and shortlisted for the RTÉ Short Story competition and Redline Book Festival. Dee also regularly mentors and teaches for the NTAA, Creative Skillnet and Blinder Films Incubator Scheme.

FESTIVAL FINALE

Nurtured New Works is the heart of *Scripts – Ireland's Playwriting Festival*, where emerging voices are given space to grow, challenge and connect. After a week of mentoring, editing and directing, our selected Scripts Playwrights' plays will be brought from page to stage in a rehearsed reading by some of Ireland's leading actors. The awarded playwright will be chosen by our esteemed judging panel, Selina O'Reilly (The Abbey Theatre) and Colm O'Callaghan (The Gate Theatre).

This year, our three selected playwrights – Róisín Daly, James Peaty and Lisa Walsh – have taken deeply personal and dramatically distinct approaches to the festival theme, *Perceptions*.

Each play invites us to look again: at the stories we tell ourselves, the truths we avoid, and the moments that reshape how we see the world. From the murky lines of memory and consent, to the claustrophobic tension of unresolved family trauma, to the surreal chaos of city-wide unrest – these nurtured works question what we think we know, revealing how perception can shift, crack and ultimately transform. Followed by discussion and announcement of awarded playwright.

brother – comes knocking at their door. It's not a pleasant house call and soon long buried secrets, resentments and violence rear their head.

Laura Kelly took a dreamy notion to go to a mad and beautiful book launch even though she doesn't speak Irish, a decision that has her trapped as the Dublin Riots erupt. She has to find a way home. An

embrace from an unexpected source lights a flame and plants a seed of strength as she rattles on through the madness in her city. Encountering violence, confusion, chaos, a bearded clam, grief, love and ultimately hope.
